


Applications Open for Virtual Institute Connecting Rural Institutions to Guided Pathways Movement

Applications are now open for the Community College Research Center (CCRC) summer 2021 virtual institute, **Guided Pathways at Rural Colleges: Using Data to Launch Large-Scale Reform**. This two-week experience, funded by MDRRC, is designed to help rural and rural-serving colleges overcome unique challenges they face in implementing guided pathways reforms and is available at no charge to participants.

Applications are due Monday, March 15 by 11:59 p.m. PST. CCRC will conduct short interviews with college teams under consideration during the last two weeks of March, with colleges selected to participate notified by Monday, April 1.

Now, with a recent vote to reverse a longstanding ban on Pell Grants for incarcerated learners, more incarcerated people will have access to federal resources for postsecondary education in prison programs. This grant supports the Center on Rural Innovation in researching foundational questions related to building an inclusive tech workforce in rural America. Research will be synthesized into a public-facing report that will drive real impact on creating skilling pipelines, localizing outsourced tech jobs and leveraging the power of remote work in rural areas — ultimately setting the stage for low-income rural learners to achieve their academic and career goals in the fast-growing, high-paying fields of the digital economy.

Defining What It Means to Be a Rural-Serving Postsecondary Institution

This grant supports Appalachian State University and researchers from the Alliance for Research on Regional Colleges in utilizing and analyzing various data sources to develop a formal definition of operating as a "rural serving postsecondary institution." The team will create a series of interactive data tools, corresponding documentation and a list of institutions that meet this definition.
