
New Podcasts Shine Light on Rural Voices, Partners


Insights Gained from Rural Respondents in ECS Special Report

Placement testing often determines whether a student is required to take developmental education courses or college-level courses upon entry to postsecondary education. Placement testing can also be a barrier for students, which is why Ascendium supported the research captured in [this resource](#) by MDRC and the Community College Research Center which explores an alternative to high-stakes placement testing.


COVID-19 Transfer, Mobility, and Progress: Final Look Spring 2021 Report

The National Student Clearinghouse Research Center released the fourth of a nine-part report series to provide institutions and researchers with near real-time data on how the COVID-19 health crisis is impacting transfer students. [This report](#), co-funded by Ascendium and ECMC Foundation, shows transfer overall was down 10% and community college transfer enrollment declined 16.3%, a worrisome trend for learners from low-income backgrounds.




Optimal College Financial Aid: Theory and Evidence on Free College, Early Commitment, and Merit Aid from an Eight-Year Randomized Trial

Utilizing data collected through The Degree Project, a partnership between Ascendium, Milwaukee Public Schools and researchers, [this working paper](#) analyzes how promise programs and the design of financial aid programs affect a variety of high school, college and life outcomes.


How Ohio Community Colleges Are Using Guided Pathways to Personalize Student Support
